GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Rules

The 23rd SEA Games Archery Competition will be conducted in accordance with the FITA Rule Book. In case of a disagreement in the interpretation of rules from versions in different languages, the English text will prevail. Any unforeseen incident not covered by the Rules shall be dealt with accordingly in the following manner:

- 1.1.** Technical questions shall be resolved in accordance with the FITA Rules.
- 1.2.** Cases of general nature shall be resolved in accordance with the SEA Games Federation (SEAGF) Statutes and Rules (2005). Particularly, the following rules shall have precedence:

SEAGF Rules 31 : Eligibility Code

To be eligible for participation in the SEA Games, a competitor must comply with the SEA Games Federation Statutes and Rules as well as Rules 45 and the By-Laws to Rule 45 of the Olympic Charter.

SEAGF Rule 32 – Nationality of Competitor

Only nationals of the country of the NOC shall be qualified to represent the NOC in the Games. All disputes relating to the determination of the country which competitor may represent in the SEA Games shall be resolved by the Executive Committee in accordance with the By-Laws to Rule 46 of the Olympic Charter.

SEAGF Rule 34 – Medical Code:

- a. Doping violation as defined by the WADA Code is forbidden.
- b. All competitors are liable to medical control and examination carried out in conformity with the rules of the International Olympic Committee Medical Commission, the WADA Anti-Doping Code and Explanatory documents.
- c. Competitors in sports restricted to women must comply with the prescribed tests for femininity, when needed.
- d. Any competitor refusing to submit for a medical control or examination or is found guilty of an Anti-doping violation shall be excluded from the SEA games. The principles of exclusion for teams and individuals shall be in accordance with the WADA Code.
- e. A medal may be withdrawn by order of the Executive Committee on the proposal of the Chairman of the Organizing Committee.
- f. A Medical Commission as approved by the Medical Committee of the SEAG Federation will be set up to implement these rules. Members of which be nominated by their respective NOC as approved by the Medical Commission of the SEAG Federation.
- g. The above regulations shall in no way affect further sanctions by the International Federation.

SEAGF Rule 38 – Number of Entries:

The maximum number of entries from each nation in each event is fixed by the Federation in consultation with the Host NOC. However, the following numbers cannot be exceeded:

- a. For individual events, including singles and doubles event, there shall only be two (2) entries from each NOC (excluding reserves). For the sports of Arnis,

Bodybuilding, Boxing, Judo, Karate-do, Muay, Pencak Silat, Taekwondo, Weightlifting, Wrestling, and Wushu, there shall only be one (1) entry per weight category from each NOC, and for Sailing where there shall only be one (1) entry per event from each NOC. Any event with three (3) or more members to make up a team shall be deemed to be a team event, and there shall only be one team (entry) from each NOC.

- b. For team events, one (1) team per nation, the number of reserves shall not exceed the number of players allowed by the International Federation.
- c. For events where both team and individual competitions are conducted at the same time, the competitors for any one NOC cannot win more than two (2) medals in their respective individual events.

SEAGF Rule 41 – International Federation:

- a. The Organizing Committee shall write to the International Federation or the Asian Sports Federation concerned for their permission to hold their sport in the Games. The Organizing Committee may invite a representative who shall arrive at least three (3) days before the beginning of the first event of their sport in order to check the facilities and equipment and arrange the entries, which conform to its rules and the rules of the SEAGF.
- b. The Organizing Committee shall pay the accommodation, meals and local expenses of its representative at the established rate of the Organizing Committee until two (2) days after the closing of their competition.
- c. In exceptional cases, if for technical reasons the presence of additional delegates is necessary, the appropriate arrangements shall be made with the Organizing Committee; the Executive Committee must be previously informed. In case of disagreement, the Executive Committee shall decide.

SEAGF Rule 42 – Technical Officials and Jury of Appeal:

- a. The necessary Technical Officials (referees, judges, umpires, timekeepers, inspectors, etc.) and a Jury of Appeal for each sport shall be appointed by the appropriate National Federation of the Host Country, which shall direct their work in conjunction with the Organizing Committee.
- b. If technical officials are needed from the other Member Organizations, to be invited to the Games, the Organizing Committee shall seek approval from the Executive Committee. Should the Executive Committee approve the request, the Organizing Committee shall pay their expenses for accommodation, meals, and local transport for the whole period of the Games.
- c. The technical officials and the members of the Jury of Appeal must have never been professionals in sport.
- d. No official who has participated in a decision may serve in the Jury of Appeal that reviews it. The findings of the Jury shall be communicated as soon as possible to the Organizing Committee and the Executive Committee.
- e. Technical officials may not live in the Games Villages, but the Organizing Committee shall ensure and bear the cost of their living accommodation, including board and local transport facilities.
- f. The Jury of Appeal's decision on all technical questions concerning its respective disciplinary nature is final. They shall, however, be without prejudice to any further penalty, which may be imposed by the Executive Committee.

- g. The Jury of Appeal shall be composed of a Chairman/ woman, which position shall be filled up by the Host Country of the Games with a representative of each member country as members.
- h. The International Technical delegates to the Games may be appointed ex-officio members of the body and shall act only in an advisory capacity, unless their respective International Federation requires otherwise
- i. In the event of a dispute or protest relative to technical questions concerning its respective sporting event, representatives of countries in the Jury of Appeal whose countries are involved in the dispute or protest may be allowed to participate in the deliberations, but cannot vote in the resolution of the protest or dispute.

SEAGF Rule 43 – Court of Appeal

The Executive Committee on behalf of the Federation is the Court of Appeal, which will decide finally on all questions concerning the Games. NOCs or the Organizing Committee may submit questions to the Court of Appeal. In addition the Court of Appeal may intervene in all questions of non-technical nature outside the Jurisdiction of the Juries of Appeal set up for each sport in the programme.

SEAGF Rule 44 – Claims and Protests

- a. Claims and protests made to the judges on the grounds concerning matters of fact are decided by them without appeal. Appeals against other decisions of the Judges or with regard to any other matter must be addressed to the Chairman of the Jury of Appeal for the sport concerned by a representative of the NOC of the country making the appeal.
- b. For exceptional circumstances, any claim must be made within thirty (30) minutes of the decision giving rise to the claim. The Jury of Appeal after an investigation shall then give a decision and this decision shall be irrevocable, except for the case of a disqualification of a team or of a competitor for infraction of the Southeast Asian Games Federation, which shall be decided by the Court of Appeal. All claims and appeals must be made in writing.

SEAGF Rule 45 – Penalties in Case of Fraud:

A competitor proved fraudulently to have transgressed the Rules and Regulations of the Southeast Asian Games Federation, shall be disqualified and lose any position he/she may have gained. If this competitor’s NOC is proved to have been a party to the fraud, his/her country shall be disqualified in the sport involved.

2. Participants

- 2.1. The 23rd SEA Games Archery Competition is reserved for teams representing National Olympic Committees affiliated to the SEA Games Federation.
- 2.2. Only competitors who comply with the conditions laid down in the SEAGF Statutes and Rules (2005) and the FITA Rules are entitled to participate.
- 2.3. Each country may enter up to eight (8) men and eight (8) women competitors and four (4) officials; however the total number of officials must not exceed the number of competitors. One of the officials chosen shall be available for appointment as one of the seven (7) judges.

3. Entries

- 3.1. Entries in each participating country must be submitted in accordance with the regulation laid down by the Organizing Committee of the 23rd SEA Games.
- 3.2. Preliminary Deadline for “Entry by Number”
Preliminary entry forms by number from each participating country, forwarded through the respective National Olympic Committee (NOC), must be completed and should be received by PhilSOC not later than 31 May 2005 at 2400 hours Philippine time (GMT +8).
- 3.3. Final Deadline for “Entry by Name”
The entry forms by name must be received by PhilSOC not later than 27 October 2005 at 2400 hours Philippine time (GMT +8).

4. Technical Meeting

The Technical Meeting will be held one (1) day before the commencement of the competition. The time and venue of the meeting will be announced later.

COMPETITION GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Technical Organization

The National Archery Association of the Philippines (NAAP) is responsible for and has full control of the Technical Organization of the entire Archery competition, in consultation with the FITA Rule Book.

2. System of Competition

This competition will consist of FITA Target Outdoor Round (Qualification Round) and an Outdoor Olympic Round (Elimination Round and Final Round) both for recurve and compound bow division for men and women.

2.1. Individual Competition

2.1.1. Qualification/Ranking Round: A Single FITA round, in which all archers shoot simultaneously with 2 of 3 archers on each target, 6 arrows in 4 minutes at the longer distance (90m, 70m, & 60m) and 3 arrows in 2 minutes at the shorter distances (50m & 30m).

2.1.2. Elimination Round: Only two (2) competitors from each NOC will be accepted or counted for individual event. Top 32 women and top 32 men are

seeded according to their position in the Qualification Round (see Olympic Round Individual Seeding Diagram). They shoot a series of matches in-groups, each match consisting of three (3) ends of six (6) arrows shot in four (4) minutes at 70 meter in 122cm target face.

2.1.3. Quarter Final Round: The top eight (8) women and top eight (8) men remaining from the Elimination Round shoot individual matches, each match consisting of four (4) ends of three (3) arrows at 70 meter on 122 cm target faces, culmination in the Gold Medal match. The matches shall be shot on one after the other. The competitors shall alternate shooting one (1) arrow, 40 seconds per arrow.

2.1.4. Semi Final Round: The top four (4) women and top four (4) men remaining from the Quarter Final Round shoot individual matches, each match consisting of four (4) ends of three (3) arrows at 70 meters on 122 cm target faces, culminating in the Gold Medal match. At FITA Outdoor Target Championships, the matches shall be shot one after the other/ The competitors shall alternate shooting one (1) arrow at a time, 40 seconds per arrow.

2.1.5. Bronze Medal Match: The two (2) losers of the Semi Final Round will each shoot 12 arrows at 70m on a 122cm target face. The two (2) archers will alternate shooting and each will have a time of 04 seconds to get set and shoot each arrow.

2.1.6. Gold Medal Match: The two (2) winners of the Semi-final Round will each shoot four (4) ends of three (3) arrows at 70m on a 122 cm target face. The two archers will alternate shooting and each will have a time of 40 seconds to get set and shoot each arrow.

2.2. Men's and Women's Team Competition

The men's and women's team will shoot separately in the following:

2.2.1. Team Elimination Round: the top eight (8) teams of three (3) competitors (8 women's and 8 men's teams) seeded according to their positions as determined by their total score in the Qualification Round (see Olympic Round Team Seeding Diagram), shoot simultaneously a series of matches. Each match consisting of three (3) ends of nine (9) arrows shot in three minutes at 70 meters on 122cm target face.

2.2.2. Team Finals Round: The top four (4) teams of men and women remaining from the Elimination Round shoot a series of individual's matches. Each match consisting of three (3) ends of nine (9) arrows shot in three (3) minutes at 70 meters on 122 cm target face, culmination in the Team Gold Medal match.

2.2.3. Bronze Medal Match: The two (2) losers of the Team Finals round must shoot three (3) ends of nine (9) arrows within three minutes at 70 meters on a 122cm target face.

2.2.4. Gold Medal Match: The two (2) winners of the Team Finals round must shoot three (3) ends of nine (9) arrows within three minutes at 70 meters on a 122cm target face.

Note: In the Elimination Round in case total archers/teams participating in less than 32 archers/8 teams, the top archers /team will “bye”.

3. Draw

After the final entries have been received, the draw for target number and for order of the shooting order will be held according to the FITA Rules. Two (2) archers will be assigned to each target.

4. Judge Commission

A Judge Commission (JC) will consist of at minimum of three (3) FITA International Judges and/or FITA Representative totaling not less than fifteen (15) judges (or nine).

The Judges shall be appointed by each participating country, approved by FITA. One of the judges shall be appointed as Chairman. There shall be no less than one (1) judge for every seven (7) targets.

The duties of the Judges are described in Article 3.11, Book 1 of the FITA Constitution and Rules.

Consultation will take place if necessary between the Judges, Technical Delegates and the Shooting Director.

5. Complaints, Disputes and Appeals

The Judge Commission will be responsible for considering any technical complaint or dispute and taking action whenever necessary. A Judge’s decision is final with respect to the value of an arrow in a target and must be resolved before any arrow has been removed.

6. Dress Code

All archers shall wear the clothing specified in the FITA Rules (Dress Regulations, Article 3.22, Book 1) in competitions and official ceremonies.

7. Equipment

All equipment and technical installations will comply with the FITA Rules and Regulations.

PRIZES AND COMMENDATION

1. Victory Ceremonies

The Victory Ceremonies shall normally be held after the completion of each event. Participants receiving awards must wear official NOC uniform.

2. Prizes

The prizes will be awarded as follows:

2.1. Individual Events

First Prize:	Gold Medal and Diploma to the winner of each event.
Second Prize:	Silver Medal and Diploma to the archer placed second in each event.
Third Prize:	Bronze Medal and Diploma to the archer placed third in each event.
4 th – 6 th :	Diploma to the archers placed fourth to sixth in each event.

2.2. Team Event

First Prize:	Gold Medal and Diploma to each member of the winning team.
Second Prize:	Silver Medal and Diploma to each member of the team placed second.
Third Prize:	Bronze Medal and Diploma to each member of the team placed third.

There shall be no tie for gold, silver or bronze medal placing, except in events where there is no play-off between the losing semi-finalists for the bronze medal. Should there be a tie at the end of a competition for the gold, silver, or bronze placing, a sudden death play-off shall be held to break the tie.
