3. Technical Committee

a. JURY

The Host Country shall invite at least five (5) Jury members nominated by FAMA. The five working juries will be assigned by the Technical Delegates in accordance with the rules of FAMA.

b. REFEREE / JUDGE

Each participating country shall provide one (1) Referee/Judge who will be chosen by FAMA. However, the host country may opt to designate three (3) Referee/Judges. The three (3) neutral Judges will be designated by FAMA.

COMPETITION INFORMATION

1. Dates and Venues

The 23rd SEA Games Muay Competition will be held from December 1-4, 2005 at the GSIS Gym, Pasay City.

2. Events

The 23rd SEA Games Muay Competition will be contested in the following events for men only:

2.1. Wai Kru Competition

a. For men's event:

Light Welterweight Category – not below 57 kg but not over 60 kg

b. For women's event:

Bantamweight Category – not below 51 kg but not over 54 kg

Featherweight Category – not below 54 kg but not over 57 kg

2.2. Muay Competition

a. Men's four (4) events:

Light Flyweight

- not below 45 kg but not over 48 kg

Flyweight

- not below 48 kg but not over 51 kg

Bantamweight

- not below 51 kg but not over 54 kg

Featherweight

- not below 54 kg but not over 57 kg

Competition Duration:

Four (4) rounds of two (2) minutes each, with a one (1) minute resting interval between rounds.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Rules

The 23rd SEA Games Muay Competition will be conducted in accordance with the Rules of the Federation of Amateur Muay Thai of Asia (FAMA). In case of a disagreement in the interpretation of rules from versions in different languages, the English text will prevail. Any unforeseen incident not covered by the FAMA Rules shall be dealt with accordingly in the following manner:

- 1.1.** Technical questions shall be resolved in accordance with the FAMA Rules.
- 1.2.** Cases of general nature shall be resolved in accordance with the SEA Games Federation (SEAGF) Statutes and Rules (2005). Particularly, the following rules shall have precedence:

SEAGF Rule 31 – Eligibility Code

To be eligible for participation in the SEA Games, a competitor must comply with the SEA Games Federation Statutes and Rules as well as Rule 45 and the By-Laws to Rule 45 of the Olympic Charter.

SEAGF Rule 32 – Nationality of Competitor

Only nationals of the country of the NOC shall be qualified to represent the NOC in the Games. All disputes relating to the determination of the country which competitor may represent in the SEA Games shall be resolved by the Executive Committee in accordance with the By-Laws to Rule 46 of the Olympic Charter.

SEAGF Rule 34 – Medical Code:

- a. Doping violation as defined by the WADA Code is forbidden.
- b. All competitors are liable to medical control and examination carried out in conformity with the rules of the International Olympic Committee Medical Commission, the WADA Anti-Doping Code and Explanatory documents.
- c. Competitors in sports restricted to women must comply with the prescribed tests for femininity, when needed.
- d. Any competitor refusing to submit for a medical control or examination or is found guilty of an Anti-doping violation shall be excluded from the SEA games. The principles of exclusion for teams and individuals shall be in accordance with the WADA Code.
- e. A medal may be withdrawn by order of the Executive Committee on the proposal of the Chairman of the Organizing Committee.
- f. A Medical Commission as approved by the Medical Committee of the SEAG Federation will be set up to implement these rules. Members of which be nominated by their respective NOC as approved by the Medical Commission of the SEAG Federation.
- g. The above regulations shall in no way affect further sanctions by the International Federation.

SEAGF Rule 38 – Number of Entries:

The maximum number of entries from each nation in each event is fixed by the Federation in consultation with the Host NOC. However, the following numbers cannot be exceeded:

- a. For individual events, including singles and doubles event, there shall only be two (2) entries from each NOC (excluding reserves). For the sports of Arnis, Bodybuilding, Boxing, Judo, Karate-do, Muay, Pencak Silat, Taekwondo, Weightlifting, Wrestling, and Wushu, there shall only be one (1) entry per weight category from each NOC, and for Sailing where there shall only be one (1) entry per event from each NOC. Any event with three (3) or more members to make up a team shall be deemed to be a team event, and there shall only be one team (entry) from each NOC.
- b. For team events, one (1) team per nation, the number of reserves shall not exceed the number of players allowed by the International Federation.
- c. For events where both team and individual competitions are conducted at the same time, the competitors for any one NOC cannot win more than two (2) medals in their respective individual events.

SEAGF Rule 41 – International Federation:

- a. The Organizing Committee shall write to the International Federation or the Asian Sports Federation concerned for their permission to hold their sport in the Games. The Organizing Committee may invite a representative who shall arrive at least three (3) days before the beginning of the first event of their sport in order to check the facilities and equipment and arrange the entries, which conform to its rules and the rules of the SEAGF.
- b. The Organizing Committee shall pay the accommodation, meals and local expenses of its representative at the established rate of the Organizing Committee until two (2) days after the closing of their competition.
- c. In exceptional cases, if for technical reasons the presence of additional delegates is necessary, the appropriate arrangements shall be made with the Organizing Committee; the Executive Committee must be previously informed. In case of disagreement, the Executive Committee shall decide.

SEAGF Rule 42 – Technical Officials and Jury of Appeal:

- a. The necessary Technical Officials (referees, judges, umpires, timekeepers, inspectors, etc.) and a Jury of Appeal for each sport shall be appointed by the appropriate National Federation of the Host Country, which shall direct their work in conjunction with the Organizing Committee.
- b. If technical officials are needed from the other Member Organizations, to be invited to the Games, the Organizing Committee shall seek approval from the Executive Committee. Should the Executive Committee approve the request, the Organizing Committee shall pay their expenses for accommodation, meals, and local transport for the whole period of the Games.
- c. The technical officials and the members of the Jury of Appeal must have never been professionals in sport.

- d. No official who has participated in a decision may serve in the Jury of Appeal that reviews it. The findings of the Jury shall be communicated as soon as possible to the Organizing Committee and the Executive Committee.
- e. Technical officials may not live in the Games Villages, but the Organizing Committee shall ensure and bear the cost of their living accommodation, including board and local transport facilities.
- f. The Jury of Appeal's decision on all technical questions concerning its respective disciplinary nature is final. They shall, however, be without prejudice to any further penalty, which may be imposed by the Executive Committee.
- g. The Jury of Appeal shall be composed of a Chairman/ woman, which position shall be filled up by the Host Country of the Games with a representative of each member country as members.
- h. The International Technical delegates to the Games may be appointed ex-officio members of the body and shall act only in an advisory capacity, unless their respective International Federation requires otherwise
- i. In the event of a dispute or protest relative to technical questions concerning its respective sporting event, representatives of countries in the Jury of Appeal whose countries are involved in the dispute or protest may be allowed to participate in the deliberations, but cannot vote in the resolution of the protest or dispute.

SEAGF Rule 43 – Court of Appeal

The Executive Committee on behalf of the Federation is the Court of Appeal, which will decide finally on all questions concerning the Games. NOCs or the Organizing Committee may submit questions to the Court of Appeal. In addition the Court of Appeal may intervene in all questions of non-technical nature outside the Jurisdiction of the Juries of Appeal set up for each sport in the programme.

SEAGF Rule 44 – Claims and Protests

- a. Claims and protests made to the judges on the grounds concerning matters of fact are decided by them without appeal. Appeals against other decisions of the Judges or with regard to any other matter must be addressed to the Chairman of the Jury of Appeal for the sport concerned by a representative of the NOC of the country making the appeal.
- b. For exceptional circumstances, any claim must be made within thirty (30) minutes of the decision giving rise to the claim. The Jury of Appeal after an investigation shall then give a decision and this decision shall be irrevocable, except for the case of a disqualification of a team or of a competitor for infraction of the Southeast Asian Games Federation, which shall be decided by the Court of Appeal. All claims and appeals must be made in writing.

SEAGF Rule 45 – Penalties in Case of Fraud:

A competitor proved fraudulently to have transgressed the Rules and Regulations of the Southeast Asian Games Federation, shall be disqualified and lose any position he/she may have gained. If this competitor's NOC is proved to

have been a party to the fraud, his/her country shall be disqualified in the sport involved.

2. Participants

- 2.1.** The 23rd SEA Games Muay and Wai Kru Competitions are reserved for teams representing National Federations affiliated to the SEA Games Federation.
- 2.2.** Only competitors who comply with the conditions laid down in the SEAGF Statutes and Rules (2005) and the FAMA Rules are entitled to participate.
- 2.3.** Each participating country may enter one (1) boxer per weight category. As for Wai Kru must be two (2) contestants per weight category.
- 2.4.** Participants must be at least seventeen (17) years old and not more than thirty-seven (37) years old on the first day of the Muay and Wai Kru competitions.

3. Entries

- 3.1.** Entries in each participating country must be submitted in accordance with the regulation laid down by the Organizing Committee of the 23rd SEA Games.
- 3.2.** Preliminary Deadline for “Entry by Number”
Preliminary entry forms by number from each participating country, forwarded through the respective National Olympic Committee (NOC), must be completed and should be received by PhilSOC not later than 31 May 2005 at 2400 hours Philippine time (GMT +8).
- 3.3.** Final Deadline for “Entry by Name”
The entry forms by name must be received by PhilSOC not later than 27 October 2005 at 2400 hours Philippine time (GMT +8).
- 3.4.** Both entries by number and name may be sent by fax or e-mail, but must subsequently be confirmed with the original documents, by mailing them to the following address:

4. Technical Meeting

The Technical Meeting will be held one (1) day before the commencement of the competition. The time and venue of the meeting will be announced later.

COMPETITION GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Technical Organization

The Muay Council of the Philippines is responsible for and has full weigh-in for the technical organization of the Muay and Wai Kru competitions, in accordance with the FAMA Rules and in consultation with the International Technical Delegate when necessary.

2. System of Competition

2.1. This competition will be fought in elimination format. The winner of the finals match shall receive the gold medal and the loser will receive the silver medal, while the losing semi-finalists shall both receive bronze medals.

3. Draw

The draw shall take place under the direction of the Tournament Committee after the General medical examination and weigh-in and in the presence of the official representatives of the participating countries mentioned.

Boxers who draw a “bye” must begin fighting in the second round.

4. Medical Examination and Weigh-In

All Boxers must be ready to weigh-in not less than three (3) hours before the scheduled event. If the bout must begin after this time limit, the officials must secure approval from the Medical Committee before commencing the bout.

The boxer's weight is considered final, and the contestant will be assigned to that division for the event. The contestant is only allowed to weigh-in once, and only on officially-approved scales. Contestants will be weighed in their underwear. Electronic scales may be used.

5. Seconds and Assistants

Each boxer may have one second and one assistant at ringside. They must obey the regulations defined in Rule 9 of the FAMA Rules and Regulations.

6. Referees

One (1) referee approved by FAMA will control the ring but will not score for the boxers.

7. Judges

7.1. There must be five (5) qualified judges approved by the FAMA to score the round each bout.

7.2. Each judge shall make decisions for each bout independently in accordance with the rules.

7.3. During the bout, the judges shall not discuss any matters among the panel, or any other person present except the referee.

7.4. Immediately after the end of each round, the judges shall score for each boxer on their score sheet. After the match, the judge shall compile the scores to

identify the winner and sign the score sheet. The final decision shall be made to the public on the scoreboard.

7.5. Judges shall remain in their seats until the results have been announced.

8. Jury

8.1. The Jury in the Muay and Wai Kru competitions shall consist of no less than three (3) members and no more than five (5), including the Chairman. However, the Chairman of the Muay competition shall be different from the Wai Kru competition. Two jurors will be members of the referees and judges Committee.

8.2. Each juror must score for the boxers in each bout, and compare the score with the Judges' cards. The jurors must then check the cards for discrepancies between the scores, boxers' names, and the winner. They must also check the cards for the judges' signatures and decisions when determining the winner.

8.3. After all events for that day have concluded, the jurors shall meet the following morning to discuss the performance of the Referees and Judges.

9. Equipment

All equipment and technical installations will comply with the FAMA Rules and Regulations. The Rings will be installed according to FAMA Rule 1. Gloves, body, groin, and shin protectors, bandages, elbow pads and head guards will be supplied by the Tournament Committee and will conform to FAMA standards.

PRIZES AND COMMENDATION

1. Victory Ceremonies

The Victory Ceremonies shall normally be held after the completion of each event. Participants receiving awards must wear official NOC uniform.

2. Prizes for Muay

First Prize: Gold Medal (1) and Diploma to the winner in each weight category.

Second Prize: Silver Medal (1) and Diploma to the first runner-up in each category.

Third Prize: Bronze Medal (2) and Diploma to two second runner-up in each category.

3. Prizes for Wai Kru

First Prize: Gold Medal (1) and Diploma to the winner in each weight category.

Second Prize: Silver Medal (1) and Diploma to the first runner-up in each category.

Third Prize: Bronze Medal (2) and Diploma to the second runner-up in each category.
